## The Centre Provides Opportunities for Sharing in Ministry

The center in Port Moresby built by Wycliffe Associates of USA in 1991 has been

the rallying point for the Church and the Bible translation movement in PNG. The centre provides many opportunities for sharing ministry for many people—both citizens of PNG and visitors from all around the world.

The centre was built to provide facilities for BTA and SIL to serve both organizations in networking and relating to the many church groups, government agencies and NGOs in the City of Port Moresby.

Since its establishment, and its heavy use, the facilities are in need of repair, maintenance and renovations. BTA has the title deed to the centre and is responsible for its upkeep and further develop-

ment.

Early this year Wycliffe USA graciously responded to

the need for funding to carry out some of the maintenance and renovation work.

The project to begin renovations began in April with volunteers helping to cut down costs of labour. The first group of volunteers were from the OM Ship MV Doulos. The ship was in

Port Moresby for three weeks serving the churches. The young peo-

ple did some painting and scrubbing. The Wycliffe Associates (USA) PNG manager organized for one of the local carpenters

from Ukarumpa to begin renovation of one of the flats. Then in July a group from Oak Cliff Bible Fellowship in Dallas, TX, USA, did more painting and various jobs.

This project will continue into 2009. Many aspects of the project remain unfinished and will be carried out with further volunteer help in the months ahead.

### Serving the Bible Translation Movement in PNG

The centre provides facilities for BTA and SIL staff to serve the Bible translation ministry in PNG.

Currently BTA has four staff members working out of the centre. The functions this staff are responsible for include church mobilization and partnership development, finance accounting, language program coordination, literacy training and promotions.

BTA also handles visas and work permits for those wishing to work with BTA, and providing essential link to the local churches.

SIL staff on the other hand provides the vital services of taking care of expatriate missionary work permits and visas, meeting international guests and workers, as well as providing transit accommodation to their members and co-workers.

BTA staff entertains many visitors, both locals and international traveling through Moresby at this

The main meeting hall can seat up to 150 people, with facilities for catering and amenities.

This hall is heavily used for meetings and training courses. The administration building has 13 office rooms. BTA and SIL staff use this hall and other rooms for meeting and work. Six rooms are rented out to other Christian organizations. The rentals help towards the upkeep of the facilities.

Many church groups use the centre for their meetings.

International guests connected with the Bible translation ministry transit through the centre throughout the year.
